The Biological and Medicinal Chemistry Sector (BMCS) of the RSC invites applications/nominations for the BMCS Lectureship, after the successful inauguration of the Lectureship in 2014.

We live in a time of great change in medicinal chemistry. Both the process of drug discovery and the business models by which it is funded have fundamentally altered in the last generation. Yet the great benefits of new medicines to society are clear to everyone, and the expectations for future advances, as we seek to treat currently untreatable conditions, are also great. These are exciting times to be involved in medicinal chemistry. With these thoughts in mind, and especially in order to inspire the next generation of medicinal chemists, we wish to appoint the next BMCS Lecturer in a series of biennial appointments. In view of the excellent response to previous calls, it is likely we shall make two appointments.

The person appointed will have made a significant advance in the subject through developing new products or methods; there is no age restriction. He/she will be expected to deliver up to six lectures at six UK universities in the academic year 2018-2019, aimed particularly at first-year undergraduates including an initial lecture as part of the RSC's series of Thursday evening public lectures.
